Bibliography Smarter Than Their Machines: Oral Histories of the Pioneers of Interactive Computing is based on oral histories archived at the Charles Babbage Institute, University of Minnesota. Included are the oral histories of some key pioneers of the computer industry selected by John that led to interactive computing, such as Richard Bloch, Gene Amdahl, Herbert W. Robinson, Sam Wyly, J.C.R. Licklider, Ivan Sutherland, Larry Roberts, Robert Kahn, Marvin Minsky, Michael Dertouzos, and Joseph Traub, as well as his own. John has woven them together via introductions that is, in essence, a personal walk down the computer industry road. John had the unique advantage of having been part of, or witness to, much of the history contained in these oral histories beginning as a co-op student at Arthur D. Little, Inc., in the 1950's. Eventually, he would become a pioneer in his own right by creating the computer

industry's first successful software products company (Cullinane Corporation). However, an added benefit of reading these oral histories is that they contain important messages for our leaders of today, at all levels, including that government, industry, and academia can accomplish great things when working together in an effective way. This is how the computer industry was created, which then led to the Internet, both totally unanticipated just 75 years ago. William Knox (b. 1720), the son of James Knox (the Scottish emigrant to Strabane, Ireland), also had a son named William Knox (1767-1851), and two other sons, George Knox (1764-1830) and John Knox (d. 1793), all three of whom immigrated to Pennsylvania between 1785 and 1791. "A fourth son, James Knox, remained in Ireland but moved from Strabane to Castlebar in county Mayo." Descendants of the three immigrants moved to the midwest. "As part of the Treaty of Paris, in which Great Britain recognized the new United States of America, Britain ceded the land that comprised the immense Northwest Territory, a wilderness empire northwest of the Ohio River containing the future states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, and Wisconsin. A Massachusetts minister named Manasseh Cutler was instrumental in opening this vast territory to veterans of the Revolutionary War and their families for settlement. Included in the

Northwest Ordinance were three remarkable conditions: freedom of religion, free universal education, and most importantly, the prohibition of slavery. They and their families created a town in a primeval wilderness, while coping with such frontier realities as trees of a size never imagined, floods, fires, wolves, bears, even an earthquake, all the while negotiating a contentious and sometimes hostile relationship with the native people. Like so many of McCullough's subjects, they let no obstacle deter or defeat them. Drawn in great part from a rare and all-but-unknown collection of diaries and letters by the key figures, *The Pioneers* is a uniquely American story of people whose ambition and courage led them to remarkable accomplishments."--Dust jacket. things: it is both an autobiography of a second generation Romanian Canadian pioneer and a history of the community around him. HISTORY In My Life and Times, John A. Goodes tells not only his own story but also creates a detailed picture of those around him. His family, relatives, and neighbours come alive for us and we hear segments of their stories as well. John also describes in detail the conditions of the different times and places in which he sets his narrative. Sometimes he is blunt in his descriptions, but he is no less blunt in his portrayal of himself. We can look forward to reading about life in a Romanian community of settlers during the Great Depression and portrayals of a commercial nursery, a lumber camp, a boot camp in Ontario during the war, and more. We can peek into the history of the fertilizer industry, different universities and schools at those times, and work in various government programs. AUTOBIOGRAPHY "I was ordained to live a life of pioneering." John A. Goodes was born into a community of pioneers who cleared their own land, built their own farms, and learned to live in an often hostile environment. The consciousness of a pioneer was a part of him and he would carry it into his future endeavors. John

describes his farm life in interesting and entertaining detail: its challenges, its rewards, and the family tragedies. We experience with him his love of the land and of the community, his frustration with parts of the lifestyle and his dream of something different. When he reaches young adulthood John sets out on his own journey to pioneer a new life for himself. Along the way he finds that he himself is to be a pioneer in many aspects of his life and career, from finding a way to get a university degree starting with only a grade eight education, to helping introduce the use of fertilizer to the Canadian prairies, to helping design English instruction for technical students. Graham Davis tells this Irish-Texan story of the search for land by recounting the experiences of the original empresarios John McMullen, James McGloin, James Power, and James Hewetson, and he finishes the book with an impressive description of the ranching empire of Power's nephew, Thomas O'Connor. In

between, he examines the marriages, commercial contacts, political alliances, and language ties that "Mexicanized" these successful entrepreneurs. Living in the heart of the war zone, some of the Irish settlers fought for independence while others remained loyal to the Mexican government that had made them citizens and given them land. Davis offers a vivid picture of the hardships of pioneer life and the building of communities, churches, and schools. He describes how Irish ranchers had the opportunity to thrive after the annexation of Texas and emphasizes their willing acceptance of Mexican ranching methods. He makes a convincing case that the Irish came to Texas not as victims but as entrepreneurs and opportunists in search of land.
